What does it mean to be a Title I school?

- conducting parent involvement meetings/trainings/activities
- recruiting/hiring, retaining qualified teachers.

Curriculum

PNI follows the TEKS Resource System. It is a curriculum management system developed by the Texas Education Service Center Curriculum Collaborative, which is comprised of Texas' 20 Education Service Centers. The system includes a curriculum framework for grades K-12 in all foundational academic subject areas aligned to the Texas Essential Knowledge and Skills (TEKS).

Achievement Levels of the STAAR

Masters Grade Level-Indicates that students are expected to succeed in the next grade with no academic intervention.

Meets Grade Level- Indicates that students have a high likelihood of success in the next grade but may need some short-term, targeted academic intervention.

Approaches Grade Level-Indicates that students are likely to succeed in the next grade with targeted academic intervention.
