I am so excited to be working with your child in Pre-Calculus this year! Thinking about and working through the different concepts in Pre-Calculus will afford your child an invaluable approach to problem solving that will prove to be such an asset to him or her in his or her future endeavors. Success in Pre-Calculus will enable your son or daughter to go on to other academic mathematics courses needed for higher education and promising careers. Today, a good mathematical background is needed for the best positions in nearly every field.

In mathematics, each new idea builds upon previously learned ideas. Therefore, students cannot afford to fall behind. Homework exercises are assigned each class period. Students are encouraged to complete these assignments as soon as possible so they can seek extra help if they feel they do not understand something.
