

STEM Grant Award



Crystal Storms at Port Neches Middle School and Sheri Furby at PN-G High School were recently awarded STEM grants from Huntsman. Mrs. Storms’ grant funds purchased wire-bound copies of a student workbook to introduce computer science to 8th grade students at Port Neches Middle School. This mini-course will be the “Bootstrap” method to teach programming basics to the students. Within the course, students will use their programming skills to complete an interactive video game. They will also have the opportunity to develop their own game using “Bootstrap” code. Through this process, students will discover how computer programmers work to create the code used in technology application. They will also learn how computer programming relates to Pre-Algebra and Algebra I skills.

Sheri Furby, high school chemistry teacher, received the grant to purchase Break-Out Boxes. Mrs. Furby saw these at the TCEA convention in February, and immediately knew she wanted these for her classroom. The boxes are used to mimic an escape room setting with tiered activities that lead a group through levels to ultimately open the box. The Break-Out Boxes are great for critical thinking and add rigor to any topic. The best part of about it is that students are having fun while they learn and don’t even realize they are learning!
